
Guidelines for Coming to the Northern Essex Community College Campus



MVQ March General Meeting

March 16, 2023

Meeting called to order at 6:59 PM by Treasurer Diane Kelley.

Diane Kelley introduced our speaker, Adele Scott.

Business meeting called to order at 8:30PM by Liz Swan.

Secretary's Report - February guild meeting minutes are accepted as circulated. Treasurer's Report - The report for January is accepted as circulated.

Past President - Liz Swan - time to vote on the updates to by-laws. The Updates to the by-laws were reviewed and questions and comments were taken. Proposed updates to the by-laws include adding and on-line option for regular meetings, changing the manner in which we hold elections from paper ballots to electronic, holding board meetings on-line via zoom, changing the wording about all guild activities must be self-sustaining to allowing non self-sustaining activities to be considered and voted on by the board, and changing the term of service for any office from up to 3 years to up to 5 years.

Discussion and questions ensued regarding the changes, with particular concern about changing the term of service to 5 years, citing that having a 5-year term would be a long wait for new members to get involved. New members should be encouraged to get involved and mentored. Volunteerism is the heart of our guild. However, the wording in the proposed by-law states may serve up to 5 years, so that does not restrict anyone from nominating themselves for any position to be voted on at election time.

Liz Swan made a motion to pass the full slate of changes to the by-laws. Holly Read seconded the motion. A hand vote was taken, and the motion passed.

Committee Announcements

Treasurer AP - Diane Kelley - Diane is looking for someone to take over the position of TreasurerAccounts Payable.

Programs - Diane is taking sign-ups for the Jane's Quilt April workshop with Linda Pearl. Currently, 2 people have signed up. We need to have at least 8-10 members signed up by this Tuesday March 21 if the workshop is to run. Either see Diane tonight to sign up or sign up on the website and pay via PayPal or send a check to Liz Swan to the PO Box.

Travel for Raffle Quilt - Betty Hastings, Judy Naylor - Quilter's Expo needs 25 members to either sit with the raffle quilt or to white glove at the Expo. A gift of a potted plant was given to the first person to sign up to help out - Zena

Runkel. Please sign up to help out at this meeting or on-line. The Expo is one of the biggest moneymakers for the Raffle Quilt.

Nominating Committee - Layne Rando, Linda Lydecker - Additional committee members are Dot Tyler, Susan Nelson and Gail Forthoffer. The slate of officers will be presented at the April meeting.

Quilt Show - Linda Lydecker - The Quilt show is September 29-30 at Hope Church in Newburyport. Judging is at the Merrimac Library on Wednesday, Sept 27 with Pat Harrison as our judge. The fee to have a quilt judged is \$6 per quilt and can be paid by PayPal or by check sent to Liz Swan - Treasurer - AR to the PO Box with the number of quilts in the memo field on the check. Quilt Show Set-Up is Thursday, Sept 28. Quilts are needed. Members are encouraged to enter a quilt and to get it judged. Participate in the Challenge, themed "Time of the Season" with the banner size of 10-12" x 36". Enter your Mystery Quilt. There is a Quilt Show Zoom Meeting on Wednesday, March 29 for anyone who wants to get involved in the show. Let Linda Lydecker or Jamie Ruh know if you would like to attend.

Mystery Quilt - Wendy Ward - The last step, Part 6, is out on the table. Wendy is looking forward to doing another Mystery Quilt next year. Consider entering your quilt into show. If enough are entered, there may be prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. Please bring completed tops to our June meeting for show and tell.

UFO Auction - Stacey Caruso - There are about 20 baby quilt tops and backs at the front table available to be taken. These need to be quilted and bound and returned so they may be donated for our comfort quilt project.
