Guidelines for Coming to the Northern Essex Community College Campus

2026 CHALLENGE QUILT PROJECT – “I GET AROUND”

Cruising the strip at the beach this past summer, with the top down, wind in my hair, and the Beach Boys “I Get Around” on the radio, inspiration struck and a challenge was born!

For 2026, let’s tackle curves! You know, the block that engenders fear and trepidation... Take out your circle, squiggle and orange peel templates, your applipops, your “Make It Curvy” sets, Sew Kind of Wonderful Quick Curve Rulers, or your brand-new Sue Pelland “Rotary Cut Applique” rulers... That’s just some of the tools I’ve stocked up on to do curved piecing.

But let’s not stop there; how about template free curves like improve, bias tape, applique, fusible, embroidery, or embellishment – there are so many methods to choose from. Select one, two, or as many techniques as your wish and make a wall hanging that incorporates at least one curved element. Note that a curve does not have to be a complete circle, it just has to be identifiable as a non-straight line within your project, so even curves created by foundation paper piecing (which would be a series of straight lines that create a curve) would qualify.

Your project must be no larger than 18 inches wide by 22 inches long, include a top, batting, and backing, and a finished edge. Please include a hanging sleeve for display.

Quilts are due for the September 2026 Quilt Show.
